

'30 Years: Art at the Michener, 1988-2018'

opens on Sept. 16th

Beginning Sunday, September 16th, the James A. Michener Art Museum will present "30 Years: Art at the Michener, 1988-2018," a major exhibition of American art that showcases more than 50 works from the museum's permanent collection and commemorates the museum's 30th anniversary milestone.

Featuring works that are beloved by the community as well as pieces that have never before been exhibited, "30 Years" provides a unique opportunity for introspection as well as a glimpse into the treasures contained in the Michener's vault.

The exhibition will be open to the public through January 6th, 2019.

Since the Michener opened its doors in 1988, it has

expanded both its vision and its collection, which now numbers more than 3,500 paintings, sculptures, photographs, and works on paper.

The process through which these works arrived in the Michener's collection is a particular focus of the exhibition.

"30 Years" explores the stories behind the art and the collectors and celebrates the generosity of individuals who have transferred their private collections into the public trust, ensuring that their art and legacies will be experienced and enjoyed for generations to come.

In association with the exhibition, the Michener will present a series of programs, including lectures, gallery talks, concerts, and more.

"For 30 years, our com-

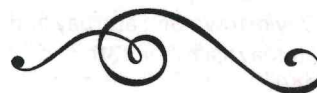

"30 Years celebrates the substantial growth of our permanent collection and reaffirms our promise to continue serving our community as stewards of a truly exceptional collection of American art."

"30 Years" also features a selection of works curated by local middle and high school students enrolled in the

Michener's Student Curators class.

These student co-curators will select, exhibit, and present new research on artworks in the Museum's collection that have not been exhibited in the galleries before.

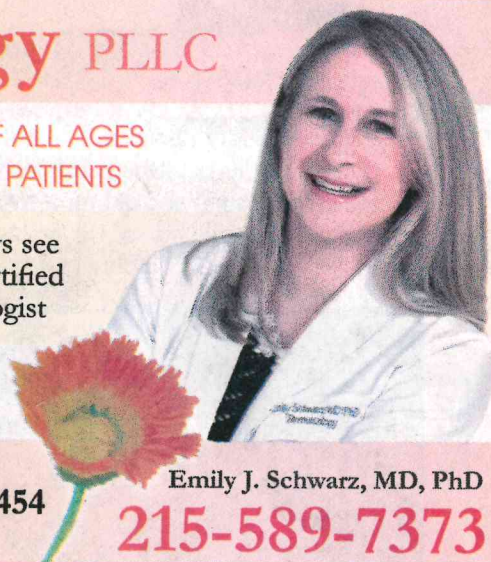
